MOST IMPORTANT - RISK ASSESS!!!

Before you commence any work at your chosen work area, you should undertake some preliminary hazard identification and risk control precautions. Ideally more than one person should do this. This is undertaken by:

- 1. Physically inspecting the work site
- Reviewing the best way/job steps required to complete the task
- 3. Reviewing the Safe Work Information supplied with the equipment
- 4. Reviewing other reference documentation and expert advice

The hazard identification and control process steps are defined as:

- Identify the Hazards (eg. 240V power drill use around wet areas)
- Assess the Risk (multi earth paths possible electrocution)
- 3. Select the Control Measure (e.g. dry the area; use an RCD; use a cordless drill etc)
- Re-assess the Risk (risk of electrocution now negligible). This is undertaken to ensure that the risk control measures adopted have not introduced any new risks to the work area.

TRUCKS Safety Do's

DO before you leave the Rental Centre, check your side mirror adjustment, our staff will be pleased to assist you.

DO spread your load over the whole tray area. Even weight distribution will allow you to carry your load with increased safety.

DO take extra care when reversing. Take it slowly and get help if you cannot see behind you clearly.

DO be sure you secure your load properly. Damage Waiver does not cover your load, or damage caused by your load shifting. The load is your responsibility.

DO stand well clear of the truck if being loaded/unloaded by either fixed or mobile plant such as overhead cranes of forklift trucks.

VANS Safety Do's

DO keep the rear roller door closed at all times



DO be aware of overhead power lines and obstructions.

DO watch your overhead clearance, particularly when reversing. Accepting the "Vehicle Cover Plus" option prior to leaving the branch can cover overhead damage.

DO be aware that some vans are fitted with tailgate loaders. Persons must not ride up or down on these and

be especially careful to keep children clear during operation. DO always have the motor running when using the tailgate loader and chock the front and back wheels. When finished ensure you remove the keys from the ignition.

DO make sure tailgate loader is securely locked in the "up" position by way of the lock latch before driving off.

Dollies. VANS Safety Don'ts

DO NOT ever leave the Van unattended with the tailgate load partially raised.

DO NOT ever allow personnel to ride on or be lifted by this equipment.

HELP

General Safety Do's

DO take your time to Read this User Guide and other Safety material (e.g. manufacturer's instructions) completely and in its entirety BEFORE operating the Vehicle.

DO seek medical advice from your doctor if you have any medical condition that may be affected by the operation and manual handling of equipment associated with Vehicle.

DO ensure that the Vehicle is suitable for your needs and working environment - Check with your CHEAPaWAY representative.

DO ensure the supplier/hirer shows you how to use the Vehicle and that you fully understand and are familiar with the Vehicle and its operations including emergency response.

DO ensure that the Vehicle and associated equipment is used according to the manufacturers and hirer's instructions.

DO check controls for proper response.

DO always tie down your load.

DO operate all vehicles in accordance with the States road rules.

DO ensure the work environment is well lit with all aspects of the job easily seen and discernable.

DO ensure that you have clear access and egress to the work area whilst on the job.

DO check the condition of the machine at the start and end of each day and report any damage or defects.

DO ensure that any guards are correctly attached and in good condition.

DO keep hands away from any moving parts.

SAFETY DON'TS

General Safety Don'ts

DO NOT operate Vehicles if tired or suffering any medical condition, or if under the influence of alcohol or drugs, which may cause lethargy or danger to you or others.

DO NOT operate a vehicle unless the audible reversing alarm is operational and discernable over the ambient environmental noise.

DO NOT ever allow persons or animals to ride on or play near the equipment.

DO NOT allow other people, children or pets into work/danger areas. (Barricade off if necessary)

DO NOT leave Vehicle running whilst unattended.

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{DO}}$ NOT overload the equipment - observe the maximum capacity.

DO NOT overload the vehicle. Overloading increases the risk of an accident.
